## NORDIC WALKING

(Translated from a Swiss magazine by John Gnos)

Can walking be reinvented?

Already decades ago, climbers and hikers in the alps used cross country ski poles in order to reach their destinations faster, more efficient and safer.

Despite disapproving glances from onlookers along the way they were not discouraged to use the advantage of this method of walking.

The engagement of the upper body and the arms relieves pressure on the knees, hips and ankles and provides additional acceleration and rhythms.

The Finns were the first people who reinvented the use of ski poles as a training aid while in summer training camps for cross country and biathlon.

Who is drawn to this new trend sport?

Nordic walking uses and trains almost all muscle groups in the body. In contrast to normal walking it burns almost twice as many calories as by normal walking and uses considerable more oxygen. Further more it releases stress in the shoulders and neck. Weight reduction can be noticed when practicing Nordic Walking on regular bases. It is also suitable for people with pre medical conditions such as high cholesterol, high blood pressure and diabetes. Nordic Walking can be the beginning to a new sport that by the way improves the immune system, the blood circulation and oxygen supply for the whole body. It is a sport that can be learned by practiced any where by everyone all year around.

Suitable Gear:

Nordic walking poles are made from modern material which is solid and light and do not convey swinging motions to the body. The hand straps on the poles facilitate walking without tiring. The length of the poles may be of personal preference but as a rule when the upper arm and the lower arm form a square it is about right. The German Nordic-Walking Club suggests the length of the poles 0.66 % of the body height. Clothing should be functional and made of breathable material. Wearing a hat is recommendable because a lot of body heat is lost through the head. The shoes should fit well and have a good grip sole.
