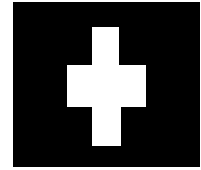



Upon arriving in Vancouver on May the 1st I had the pleasure of taking part in the 10th Presidents conference of Swiss Organizations in Western Canada in Victoria on May 6. What a great introduction that was.

The Healer

Back in '93 I visited the Philippines. While I stayed in a pleasant resort on Bohol Island I got terribly sick. Food poisoning was improbable, since I didn't throw up nor did I suffer from diarrhea. But I couldn't eat and high fevers caused me to shed pounds faster than Liza Minelli at a weightloss farm. There was no doctor on the small island, and I kind of resigned myself to the idea that I would cash in my chips right there.

"There's a healer over on Siquijor Island you should see, Mister Joe," said Alvin the cleaning boy one day, rolling the "r" in typical Filipino manner. I quickly decided that I had nothing to lose.

Two days later I felt strong enough and hired a boat for the trip to the neighbouring island. A moped taxi with a wirecage sidecar took me to the top of a mountain. A tiny settlement of about five houses was nestled among the mango trees with a small stream gurgling happily on its way down towards the Mindanao Sea. The driver stopped in front of one of the larger houses. "You see healer in there. I wait for you," he said, pointing to the open door.

A dozen patients already there greeted me with curious but friendly looks as I sat down on a pillow beside a thin fellow holding a chicken with its feet tied together, obviously his payment for the treatment. Other people held small bags containing rice, fruit or vegetables. I soon determined that half the people assembled were there for the entertainment because the treatments took place right in this room.

The healer was a young man dressed in a T shirt and shorts. When my turn came he put his hand on my shoulder, looked me in the eye and asked in broken English why I was here. I explained my predicament in as few words as possible. While I was talking, he wrote a number of mysterious signs on pieces of paper which he submerged in a glass of water. After a couple of minutes, during which he asked a few more questions, he pointed to my stomach and stated, "you not sick there; your problem here" and stabbed his index finger to my heart. "You worry, for why?"

"Well, I worry some," I admitted, "about my daughter. She lives far from me."

He nodded, handing me a sheet with a few signs on it. "Go to the other room. My mother will give you herbs to make tea. Put them in water overnight. Drink tea in the morning and again at night."

I thanked him and handed him two Hundred-Piso bills, but he waved them off. "No, my healing not for money. You put thirty Pisos (ca. \$ 2.00) into that bowl. For poor people."

Then, putting his bare foot on mine, and again placing his hand on my shoulder he asked, "what's wrong with your leg?"

I shrugged. "Nada, there's nothing wrong."

He insisted that I had a problem with my right leg, and all of a sudden I remembered my ankle joint. "Oh yes. That would be my joint. It's an artificial one made of stainless steel!"

He kept his foot on mine, seemingly listening to something, then shook his head. "Not that. Something else."

"Heck, the only other thing I can think of is my knee. I had several riding accidents. Now when I walk downhill for more than ten minutes it hurts like hell and I limp around for three days after."

He grinned, nodding his head. "Yes, that's it. You ok now."

After I collected the "herbs", which turned out to be several thick sticks, from his mother I climbed back into my taxi for the long drive back to the tiny harbour. That evening I shaved a generous quantity of my herbs into a large jar of water which I drank the next morning, finishing up the rest that same night.

Two days later I had already eaten three good meals and on the third day I was out fishing and snorkeling. After two weeks I moved to Camiguin Island where I hiked from sea level to the top of Hibok Hibok volcano, a steep three-hour march. During the return trip on the boat I suddenly realized that my knee had not hurt during the long trek down the mountainside! To this day, fourteen years later, my knee has never given me any troubles during the countless hikes I undertook in many rugged hills and mountains.
